## WHAT WE DID

The College is reviewing how tutors use technology in the classroom and has recently invested in staff training and new technology including VR equipment and new computers.

We launched the *Evolve* tutorial programme which will focus on helping you with your next steps, building resilience and supporting you with employment.

We've built a comprehensive sports programme for this year and are currently developing our competitive sports offering and trips. A lunchtime arts and crafts club started this year, and we're offering accredited enrichment activities in first aid and sign language that you can put on your CV.

We're working with the Student Wellbeing team to deliver more services at Leek and now have a designated space for this at Leek.

Clubs are advertised on screens in the Dome and at Leek, on enrichment timetables and on the new weekly enrichment timetable boards at College.

Teaching staff have reviewed their course planning to ensure practical activities are a key aspect in all of their sessions.

The College has ensured that specialist resources required to deliver programmes of study at any level are available in allocated rooms, this will be reviewed throughout the year. Our technicians are on hand to resolve any issues.
