

Fees & Finance

Studying a University Level course is a real investment in your future and with our affordably priced courses, it won't cost as much as you think.

Tuition fees

On average our course fees are about half of most other Universities. Plus, because we're local you won't need to pay for additional living and accommodation costs.

How fees work

You don't pay tuition fees up front. You can apply for a loan from the Students Loans Company for your tuition fees. You only pay this loan back when you finish your course and are earning over £21,000 a year. If you never reach that salary, you won't need to pay it back. Various other schemes are in place to help you pay for your course or to support you whilst you study. At Buxton & Leek College we're committed to financially supporting students.

YEAR ZERO

Level 3 Duration: 1 year

Description

Usually for those wanting to study an Art or Science related subject at Degree level who are not quite ready for a full Bachelor's Degree. It is the first year of a 4 year BA(Hons) degree programme that you will progress on to.

HIGHER NATIONAL CERTIFICATE (HNC)

Level 4 Duration: 1-2 years

Description

Equivalent to the first year of a Bachelor's Degree and designed to give you work related skills.

Level 5 Duration: 2-4 years

Level 5 Duration: 2-3 years

BACHELOR'S DEGREE (BA)

Level 6 Duration: 3-6 years

BA (HONS) YEAR ZERO

Level 3 Campus Start date: September

What to expect: This course is for students who have not completed a foundation course or who are not ready to go on to degree level, but who know which subject they wish to study. This

course is the first stage of a Bachelor's Degree – it is not a standalone course. Following the successful completion of the year you will then progress on to an appropriate Bachelor's Degree at the University of Derby.

You will explore and experiment with a wide range of materials, processes and ideas, building a diverse range of transferable skills. You will develop your practical and intellectual knowledge and explore, challenge and extend your visual and conceptual skills

to gain a sound understanding of art and design practice.

Duration: Four years full time (Year Zero then three years Bachelor's Degree).

Fees: £5,250

Apply: Through UCAS.

Entry requirements: 160 UCAS points of which at least 120 are from full A Levels or equivalent. 40 points can be from qualifications like the Extended Project. We also accept the Access to HE. You should also have 5 GCSEs grade A*-C or equivalent. You will be enthusiastic and motivated and have an art based portfolio.

FDA IN CREATIVE ART & DESIGN PRACTICE

Level 4 & 5 Campus

Start date: September

What to expect: This course is for students who wish to become contemporary artists, designers and makers. It is for those who want build on earlier experience across a broad range of art, craft and design practice such as fine art, painting, ceramics, crafts, textiles and more.

Students will develop their art and business skills through practical projects and opportunities to create, exhibit and sell their work. Successful students may progress to an undergraduate degree in fine art at the University of Derby or other universities dependent on an interview and portfolio of work.

Duration: Three years part time. You'll attend College all day on a Thursday and Friday morning.

Fees: £2,400 per year (subject to review).

Apply: Direct to the College.

Entry requirements: 80 UCAS points or a BTEC National Diploma/Foundation Diploma in Art & Design plus GCSE English at grade C or above. Entry requirements are flexible for those over 21 based on an interview with the Admissions Tutor.

Business

HNC BUSINESS

Level 4 Campus

Start date: January or September

What to expect: This course is designed to develop your management potential. The subjects you'll cover are broad and relevant to the business world. You'll cover relevant business and management issues with modules from marketing to economics and human resource management. This all means that you have a wealth of knowledge to take in to your employment. You'll be assessed via coursework, exams and practical business scenarios. If you're working while studying you can apply your assessments to your organisation, to make a real and immediate impact on the business you work for. The course will enable you to pursue either a specialist career in business or one in general management and also Top Up to a Bachelor's Degree at the University of Derby or other universities.

Duration: 18-24 months part time. You'll attend College on a Tuesday from 1pm-8pm.

Fees: £3,600 total course fee - annual fee depends on duration (subject to review).

Apply: Direct to the College.

Entry requirements: A minimum of 60-80 points from one full A level or a Our business department is dynamic and inspirational and covers the wide range of business disciplines that we know employers are looking for; from business accounts, product promotion, contract and business law, to managing people, marketing and communications.

Merit from the BTEC National Award or a Pass Pass from the BTFC National Certificate or an Access/Foundation course or an NVQ Level 3 in a relevant subject. Entry requirements are flexible for those over 21 based on an interview with the Admissions Tutor.

HND BUSINESS

Level 5 Campus

What to expect: This course introduces you to the core range of business and management subjects, including human resource management, accounting, marketing, economics, operations and business planning. You will learn about how these integrate and function together and see how they can be applied to real business situations.

You'll develop your innovative, entrepreneurial skills and your personal skills including reporting presentations, research, individual group work, leadership skills and self-confidence, all of which are vital in any business role.

You'll be assessed through a range of coursework and examinations. During the second stage you'll specialise in one of four pathways either in enterprise,

marketing, finance or human resource management. From this course you'll be able to pursue a specialist career in business and Top Up to a Bachelor's Dearee.

Duration: Three years part time. You'll attend College on a Tuesday from 1pm-8pm.

Fees: £2,400 per year (subject to review).

Apply: Direct to the College.

Entry requirements: A minimum of 60-80 points from one full A level or a Merit from the BTEC National Award or a Pass Pass from the BTEC National Certificate or an Access/Foundation course or an NVQ Level 3 in a relevant subject. Entry requirements are flexible for those over 21 based on an interview.



Childcare & Education

Early years staff have a strong professional identity, take pride in their work and are recognised and valued by parents, other professionals and society as a whole.

FOUNDATION DEGREE IN CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLES SERVICES FOR **EARLY YEARS PRACTITIONERS**

Level 4 & 5 Campus B

Start date: September

What to expect: Designed for practitioners currently employed in an early years environment, the course builds on your work experience and will involve support from your employer via a mentor. Topics include: child development and learning, child health planning and assessment for quality provision, safeguarding, child welfare, managing people and literacy and numeracy. You'll be assessed in the work place through presentations, case studies and portfolios. You'll also undertake written essays and research

This course could lead onto a Bachelor's Degree at the University of Derby or other universities and will help you to progress your career in an early years setting.

Duration: Three years part time (Buxton) Two years part time (Leek).



Fees: £2,400 per year (Buxton) and £3,600 per year (Leek) (subject to review).

Apply: Direct to the College.

Entry requirements: Five GCSE grades A*-C (one of these must include C in English) and a relevant and current Level 3 childcare/play work/early years qualification. Entry requirements are flexible for those over 21, with experience in an early years setting, based on an interview with the Admissions Tutor.

FOUNDATION DEGREE IN CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLES SERVICES FOR **TEACHING ASSISTANTS**

Level 4 & 5 Campus B

Start date: September

What to expect: This course has been designed for Teaching Assistants who are currently working in any type of school. You'll build on current work experience with a focus on extending knowledge and developing practical skills. Topics include the role of a Teaching Assistant, development and learning, literacy, numeracy, science and technology, inclusive education and behaviour management.

You'll be assessed in the work place through presentations, case studies,



portfolios, written essays and research. This course could lead onto a Bachelor's Degree at the University of Derby or other universities. The course will help you to progress your career in an education setting.

Duration: Three years part time (Buxton) Two years part time (Leek).

Fees: £2,400 per year (Buxton) and £3,600 per year (Leek) (subject to review).

Apply: Direct to the College.

Entry requirements: Five GCSE grades A*-C (one of these must include C in English) and a relevant and current Level 3 gualification including the CACHE Level 3 Teaching Assistants. You'll need to be working in a school setting for at least two days per week (paid or voluntary). Entry requirements are flexible for those over 21, with experience in an education setting, based on an interview with the Admissions Tutor.

CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION & POST GRADUATE CERTIFICATE OF **EDUCATION (FURTHER EDUCATION &** SKILLS)

Level 5 & 7 Campus B

Start date: September

What to expect: This course is designed for those teaching Post 14 learners in a Further Education (FE) setting, training establishment, special school, an academy, prison or young offenders institute. The course is also suitable for those who are trainers as part of their career role in industry or business or current teaching assistants.

Modules include: preparing to teach in the FE and Skills sector, developing and reflecting on practical teaching skills and the theory of teaching and learning. Graduate candidates can choose a specialist pathway in key skills, Maths, English or special educational needs.

Assessment methods include coursework, observations of teaching practice, self evaluation, reflective tasks, written assignments, presentations and group tasks. All assessments require you to apply theory to your own practice and you are expected to engage with learning theory.

This course offers a strong foundation for professional development. If you achieve the Certificate of Education and wish to progress to graduate status, you may be able to top up to a Bachelor's Degree at the University of Derby or other universities. Students who achieve a PGCE may progress to a Masters in Education.

Duration: Two years part time. You'll attend College on a Thursday afternoon from 2pm-6pm.

Fees: £2,250 per year (subject to review).

Apply: Direct to the College.

Entry requirements: At least a Level 3 gualification in a subject relevant to your teaching specialism, GCSE or an equivalent gualification in English and Maths (you can still be working towards Maths but must achieve this by the end of your first year), access to 50 hours teaching in a full teaching role each year (paid or voluntary). Applicants for the PGCE status must have evidence of at least an honours degree relevant to their teaching specialism.

(TOP UP)

Level 6 Campus Start date: September

Degree students who now wish to achieve a full BA (Hons) degree on a part time basis. Students can still be employed and attend lessons for the equivalent of half a day a week. You must be in a school placement for at least two days a week, which can be voluntary. The programme analyses various elements of the education world today and builds on the knowledge and skills the learners have already acquired from foundation degree level study. The learning sessions are based round discussions and practical activities. Following the course students may wish to think about working towards full teacher status or management roles in other areas of education.

BA (HONS) EDUCATION STUDIES

What to expect: Designed for Foundation

Duration: One year part time. You'll attend College for half a day per week or one evening per week. You should also have a school placement, either paid or voluntary for at least two days a week.

Fees: £3,600 per year (subject to review).

Apply: Through UCAS.

Entry requirements: A Foundation Degree passed with grades above 50%.

Computing

Computing & ICT has become such an important industry because it affects just about everything we do in our lives. From the mobile phones we use, the way we watch films, how we communicate, to how we do business and shop. A constantly changing discipline, it offers wide ranging career possibilities and rewarding challenges for those interested in the subject.

FOUNDATION DEGREE IN COMPUTING

Level 4 & 5 Campus B

Start date: September

What to expect: This course is designed to provide a broad introduction to computing and has a strong work based focus. The course has been designed to reflect the diverse range of skills and technologies found in modern ICT industries. You'll develop a broad range of practical skills in networking, programming, application and web development, underpinned by software engineering and computer science. Therefore, it is expected to appeal to students from a variety of computing disciplines as well as those

seeking employment in ICT.

HNC IN MECHANICAL & MANUFACTURING ENGINEERING Level 4 Campus

Start date: September

What to expect: Designed to provide specific skills and knowledge relevant to the mechanical and manufacturing engineering industry. The course will enable you to achieve the skills and confidence necessary to enhance your career. The programme is designed to meet the needs of local engineering companies, and strikes a balance between the academic, practical and work based applications and skills development.

> Modules include: applied scientific methods, engineering design and workshop technology, Computer Aided Design, SolidWorks and AutoCAD, processes, materials and manufacturing process, guality and professional development and business accountability.

Fees: £3,600 per year (subject to review).



You'll be assessed in the work place through presentations, case studies and portfolios. You'll also undertake written essays and research. This course could lead onto a Bachelor's Degree at the University of Derby or other universities and will help you to progress your career in health and social care.

Duration: Three years part time (Buxton) Two years part time (Leek).

Fees: £2,400 per year (Buxton) and £3,600 per year (Leek) (subject to review).

Apply: Direct to the College.




